

# Merit Badge Changes and Additions

## MEDICINE MERIT BADGE BEING REPLACED

Scouts who have begun work on the Medicine merit badge may continue working on it until they are finished or turn 18. After Dec. 31, 2021, Scouts may not begin working on the Medicine merit badge and should instead work on the <u>Health Care Professions</u> badge. Hard-copy editions of the Health Care Professions merit badge pamphlet should be available in mid-November.

### The Boy Scouts of America Introduces New Citizenship in Society Merit Badge



**Irving, TX – November 1, 2021**— Today, The Boy Scouts of America (BSA), one of the largest youth organizations in the United States, announced the launch of the Citizenship in Society merit badge, its newest merit badge for youth in the Scouts BSA program (ages 11-17). The new merit badge encourages Scouts to explore important topics around diversity, equity, inclusion and ethical leadership and learn why these qualities are important in society and in Scouting. Beginning July 1, 2022, the Citizenship in Society merit badge will be required for any youth seeking to achieve the prestigious Eagle Scout rank.

"The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law," said Roger Mosby, president and chief executive officer of The Boy Scouts of America. "This merit badge aligns with both the Scout Oath and Scout Law, which encourage Scouts to respect the beliefs of others, to be kind and courteous, and to help other people at all times."

The Citizenship in Society merit badge is the latest initiative as part of BSA's ongoing commitment to promoting diversity, equity and inclusion. Developed by BSA's Office of Diversity and Youth Development Office, with input from a dedicated group of Scouting volunteers, BSA youth and professional staff, the merit badge pairs Scouts with merit badge counselors who will help guide Scouts on their journey of self -discovery and facilitate discussions as Scouts seek to further understand the diverse world we live in.

"The Citizenship in Society merit badge is an important initiative to help Scouts learn about the diverse identities we each possess, understand different perspectives and experiences, and promote good citizenship in society," said Elizabeth Ramirez-Washka, chief diversity officer and vice president of diversity & inclusion, Boy Scouts of America.

The new merit badge complements existing merit badges, such as the American Cultures, Citizenship in the Community, Disability Awareness and American Heritage merit badges, which require Scouts to learn and grow their understanding of diverse perspectives and spur positive action.

"As part of earning the Citizenship in Society merit badge, I learned that it's important to understand different opinions and perspectives to become a good leader so that you're prepared to handle any situation that comes up," said Maya, a 15-year-old Scout who participated in the pilot program. "I also enjoyed getting to discuss diversity and inclusion topics with my friends in Scouting, as it felt like a safe environment to be open and honest about these topics."



Below is a portion of the Council email in regards to the registration increase.

New fees are effective August 1, 2021.

Both on the National and Council level, the Boy Scouts of America has worked hard to keep annual membership fees as low as possible but with rising costs and FOS participation declining, the fees for Connecticut Yankee Council will be as follows for 2022 re-charter:

\$72 National Membership fee for Cub Scouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing/ Sea Scouts.

\$45 National Membership fee for Explorers.

\$45 National Membership fee for Adult Volunteers .

\$25 National one-time joining for Cub Scouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing/Sea Scouts.

\$48 Council Operations fee for CubScouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing.\$12 Council Operations fee for AdultVolunteers.


\$12 Council Insurance fee for youth and volunteers .

Connecticut Yankee Council will continue to accept for consideration, confidential Operations Fee waiver forms requesting assistance from families that are unable to pay the Operations Fee. It is our intention that all youth will always be able to participate in our programs, regardless of economic circumstances.

# Connecticut Yankee Council COVID-19 Guidelines Updated 01/01/2022

## Due to the increase in prevalence of COVID-19 in our communities, Connecticut Yankee Council is adopting the following guidelines, effective January 1, 2022.

COVID-19 vaccines currently approved or authorized by FDA are effective in preventing serious outcomes of COVID-19, including severe disease, hospitalization, and death. A COVID-19 vaccination is currently recommended for everyone five years of age and older in the United States for the prevention of COVID-19.

# **General Guidance**

- Face masks <u>must be worn</u> by everyone in attendance during meetings or other indoor events. This applies to every person, youth and adult, vaccinated and unvaccinated.
- Face masks should not be worn in or near water, while eating, or while sleeping. Proper social distancing should be maintained in those circumstances.
- Each member should Be Prepared and have clean and dry face masks available to wear.
- Units and members must follow any additional guidelines imposed by local municipalities or health departments, building operators, or chartered organizations.
- The BSA "Model Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist" has been updated, effective January 1, 2022. Everyone should use this checklist prior to beginning each activity.

• Unit leaders must report, within 12 hours, confirmed or strongly suspected cases of any communicable disease infections, including COVID-19, occurring during or within 48 hours after a unit meeting or activity, to camping@ctyankee.org. Unit leaders <u>are also required</u> to promptly notify adult leaders and parents of all scouts who participated in the activity, as well as the unit's Chartered Organization Representative.

# **Overnight Camping**

- Cabins are available for program use by units, 24/7.
- Connecticut Yankee Council strongly advises against group (congregate) sleeping inside cabins or other indoor locations.
- The Council recommends that unit overnight camping be limited to tent and lean-to sites.
- Masks must be worn by everyone when indoors. . This applies to every person, youth and adult, vaccinated and unvaccinated.
- While it is recommended to sleep one person per tent, it is acceptable to camp with a maximum of two people per tent. Parental permission must be obtained by the unit leader for any youth members sharing a tent.
- When sharing a tent or lean-to, individuals should sleep no closer than 6 feet from one another. Individuals sleeping next to one another or in bunk beds should be arranged to sleep head-to-toe.
- Any member using a CPAP machine <u>must not</u> share a tent or lean-to with other members.

# Connecticut Yankee Council will review these guidelines no less than once every 30 days and make adjustments as appropriate.

# **Connecticut Yankee Council** COVID-19 Guidelines for Carpooling Recommended Best Practices January 1, 2022

Connecticut Yankee Council <u>strongly advises</u> that youth members be transported to and from an activity only by their own family member (parent or guardian).

Should a unit decide to use carpooling to and from Scouting activities, the following best practices are recommended. It should be noted, currently, neither the CDC nor the State of Connecticut have formal guidelines on carpooling.

- Any youth traveling in a vehicle with anyone other than a family member must have their parent's permission. Before giving permission, parents should be informed who the vehicle occupants are, by name. Any adult traveling in a vehicle with multiple individuals including the driver must give their consent.
- It is the Council's policy that the driver and each passenger in the vehicle wear a clean and dry face mask while inside the vehicle.
- It is strongly recommended to open windows or use the vehicle's vent system to increase air flow from the outside.
- Passengers should stay in the same group/vehicle for all portions of the trip, including the return trip.
- It is strongly recommended to leave open seats between passengers.
- Unit leaders should maintain a list of passengers in each vehicle for 72 hours after completion of a trip, to respond to questions and facilitate contact tracing.

If you OR if anyone in your household has any one or more of the following new or worsening symptoms consistent with COVID-19, all people in the household, vaccinated or unvaccinated, <u>should stay home</u>.
